

# Hamlets Community Outreach Program

The Fuller Hamlets Soccer Club held clinics for the Quinsigamond Elementary School Community. The neighborhood children practiced skills work and played in short sided scrimmages coached by Fuller Hamlets coaching staff. The goal of the clinics were to help inner city children learn the basic skills needed to enjoy playing the game and to develop needed skills to play for a team in the local area league.

Approximately forty children religiously attended the one hour clinics on Saturday mornings through February and March from 8 am to 10 am. The students, ages 9 though 13, were from for the Quinsigamond Elementary area. They worked diligently on improving their skills such as trapping, passing, heading and shooting. The students learned how to maintain possession and dispossess opponents in short-sided games as well as developing individual 1v1 skills.

The Hamlets coaches really enjoyed working with the students who, during the program, truly enjoyed coming to the clinics and were devoted to developing their skills. It was great to see the state of the balls the students were given on the onset of the program. The balls condition deteriorated as the clinics proceeded.

The Fuller Hamlets Soccer Club plan to continue the Community Outreach program next year at Quinsigamond Elementary School. There were no fees charged to the students at Quinsigamond. This program was entirely maintained by the Fuller Hamlets SC.

Members of the Fuller Hamlets community donated equipment such as shoes cleats shin-guards. The equipment was given to those children who needed them. Any additional equipment which was not used by the children is donated to Worcester Friendly House.
